

Admission and Eligibility

Adolescent Student Enrollment

Individuals 16 to 19 years of age, who do not have a high school diploma, may enroll in the afternoon or evening adult education high school diploma or GED classes as part of the district WIA program. This program runs from 11:30 a.m. -2:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Adult Student Enrollment

Individuals 16 years of age through adult, who do not have a high school diploma or that have a high school diploma from outside the United States, may enroll in the evening adult education high school diploma, GED, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes. This program runs from 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. To enroll, contact the adult education site located at 2929 Rogers Lane SW. Concurrently Enrolled High School Students

Adult students have enrollment priority in all adult education classes. High school students, age 16 and over, may take adult education classes and high school classes concurrently to make up deficient credits under certain conditions. Guidelines for concurrent student enrollment are very specific. Adult Education High School Diploma Requirements

To receive an Adult High School Diploma from the Wyoming Public Schools Community Education Program, students must earn a total of 16 credits. Credit earned for previously completed high school classes may be applied to the Adult High School Diploma.

Credit Requirements

- ☞ 3 English Credits, levels 1, 2, and 3 (English 9, 10, and 11) with a minimum score on testing at grade 9 prior to acquiring credits
- ☞ 2 Mathematic Credits, including Algebra and Geometry with a minimum score on testing at grade 9 prior to acquiring credits
- ☞ 2 Science Credits, including Biology and a Physical or Earth Science
- ☞ 3 Social Studies Credits, including World History, American History, Economics (1/2 credit), and Government/Civics (1/2 credit)
- ☞ 1 Technology Credit, minimally to include the Office Suite
- ☞ 1 Work experience/Job training credit (approval of adult education director)
- ☞ .5 Personal Finance Credit
- ☞ .5 Health Credit
- ☞ 3 elective credits in the four core subjects or other areas of interest, including:
 - additional credit for unpaid internship experience in an area that is not the current job (120+ hours)
 - additional 1/2 credit for each GED test passed
 - additional 1/2 credit for each of the three Work Keys' areas passed
 - additional 1/2 credits for other course work completed through training, schooling, or other existing of 60+ hours

NOTE: For any student wishing to have a Merit Curriculum High School Diploma there are additional credit requirements, including English 12, Physical Education, Chemistry or Physics, and an Applied Arts.

General Educational Development (GED)

The General Educational Development (GED) certificate is a great tool for not only improving your career, but also opening new doors to opportunity. By earning your GED, you are telling employers, colleges, and military recruiters of your dedication to succeed. Teachers help adult learners acquire the education that they may have previously missed or been denied. By covering five core subjects through lesson plans and teaching them in the classroom, a GED teacher helps older students pass the GED exams.

Individuals who are 16 years of age or older and have not been to regular school for one calendar year are eligible. However, if you display to a school district official, a parent/guardian, and a GED chief examiner that it is in your 'best interest' to take the exam before the one year waiting requirement, then you may take it early. It is best to contact your local testing center and make sure you are following State approved GED guidelines. Wyoming Public Schools Community Education Center is a State approved Testing Site for the GED. Any person meeting the requirements may test at the Wyoming site for a small fee, but for those enrolled in the GED program all fees are waived.

English as a Second Language (ESL) Program

The philosophy of Wyoming Adult Education Language Center is to provide quality English language instruction in a culturally rich and supportive environment: a variety of programs, professional teachers and staff, outstanding location and facilities, and a feeling of community. The ESL program offers comprehensive and intensive English programs for those who are serious about improving their English.

These classes will help **beginning** students **through advanced level** students to improve their English so they can be more successful in college, at work and in the community. Classes are offered at various levels. Students are required to take a placement test before/during registration so they can be placed into the correct level. ESL classes are designed to help individuals in the community reach a wide variety of personal, professional and academic goals through the improvement of their English skills.
